People Incorporated's Artability program is an annual celebration of the creativity and contributions of people with mental illness to our community. A series of art and writing workshops lead up to the multi-day Artability Show & Sale held each fall.

More than 100 artists from the Twin Cities and greater Minnesota participate in the workshops and art show each year. Artability is vital to the work of People Incorporated in helping individuals living with mental illness to work toward achieving their goals related to living independent and enriched lives. The show is a source of inspiration and pride for the area's mental health community, and encourages artists to explore their interests, share their love of art, and gain confidence in their skills. Artists may sell their work at the show and receive 90% of the profits, with the remaining 10% going back to support the Artability program. Writers also contribute their creative work to an anthology available for sale at the show.
