


#### 2016-2017 Budget Overview

- \$150,000 budget increase from 2015 to 2016 proposes using fund balance for Economic Gardening project
- No property tax levy



#### Where The Housing & Redevelopment Authority Dollar Goes Total 2016 Spending = \$2,000,597




