Juvenile Detention Center



- 44-bed facility
- provides secure detention for males and females ages 10 through 17
- Youth of color comprise 92% of the Admissions (2021)
- Average length of stay 16.2 days (2021)
- In 2022, of the 688 youth brought to the JDC, 460 were admitted
- 1 in 5 youth brought into JDC will stay 30 days or more

RAMSEY COUNTY

Current Juvenile Detention Center – Concerns with Physical Plant



- Building does not meet best practices for juvenile detention
- Disjointed Layout spread out over 4 floors
 - requires additional staff to ensure client safety and security
- The building needs significant updates.
 - Older structure and difficult to maintain
 - Rooms are dark and dungeon like.
 - Little natural light throughout the building
 - No green space.
 - No formal admissions area.
- Layout and location contributes to difficulty recruiting and retaining staff.
 - Metered parking for staff and families is challenging/prohibitive
 - Staff do not feel safe- assaults and other criminal activity outside the facility including theft from staff vehicles.
 - 70% staff turnover

RAMSEY COUNTY

Option 1: 297 Century Ave

- Currently houses the Ramsey County Correctional Facility
- Newer Building and in better condition
 - There is more natural light.
 - There is ample green space for outdoor recreation.
 - Ample free parking for staff and families
 - Admissions area to keep incoming youth separate
- Safer environment for the youth and staff.
- Space to build diversion center
- Underutilized county space
- More opportunity to utilize best practices for youth detention
- Improved space for youth, staff and community
