




#### Dear Commissioners:

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the two-year 2012 - 2013 Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority budgets, as approved by the Commissioners of the Authority. A copy of the resolution adopting the budgets is also enclosed. The budget amount for 2012 is \$15,202,568. The tax levy for 2012 is \$19,938,811.

The budget amount for 2013 is \$17,127,615.

Projects to be undertaken by the Regional Railroad Authority in 2012 and 2013 are:

- 1. Managing the renovation and reconstruction of the Union Depot as a multi modal transit hub.
- 2. Managing the operating of the Union Depot.
- 3. Partnering on the Central Corridor Light Rail Transit Project.
- 4. Participating on the Minnesota High Speed Rail Commission to bring high speed rail to Minnesota and the Union Depot.
- 5. Participating in the Gateway Corridor Commission to advocate and analyze transportation and transit improvements along the I-94 corridor from the Union Depot in St. Paul to Western Wisconsin.
- 6. Staffing the Rush Line Corridor Task Force and managing the study of transit service from Hinckley to St. Paul.
- 7. Participating in the Red Rock Corridor Commission and analysis of transit service improvements from Hastings to St. Paul and Minneapolis.

- 8. Participating in work on the Robert Street Corridor Alternatives Analysis.
- 9. Continuing to build working relationships with business, federal, state, metropolitan and local government agency officials and staff on transit issues.
- 10. Communicating transit needs to Congress, Legislature and others.
- 11. Seeking funding for transit projects in Ramsey County.
- 12. Staffing the Counties Transit Improvement Board.
- 13. Managing right of way owned by the Regional Railroad Authority in Roseville, St. Paul and Maplewood.
- 14. Participating in the Corridors of Opportunity.



Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority is comprised of the seven elected Ramsey County Commissioners.



WHEREAS, The Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority was organized by Resolution 87-230, April 20, 1987, Board of Ramsey County Commissioners, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, 1986, Chapter 398A, as a political subdivision and local government unit of Minnesota, to exercise thereunder part of the sovereign power of the state; and

WHEREAS, The Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority adopted the County's plan to develop and implement two year budgets beginning in 2006; and

WHEREAS, The Director of the Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority, on September 13, 2011, submitted the 2012 – 2013 Proposed Budget and 2012 tax levy of \$19,938,811; and

WHEREAS, The Truth in Taxation Law requires the Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority to certify a maximum net tax levy to the County Auditor on or before September 15; and

WHEREAS, The Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority certified a maximum net tax levy of \$19,938,811 for 2012 by Resolution R11-32, on September 13, 2009, to finance the 2012 budget; and

WHEREAS, The Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) promulgates accounting principles for all State and Local governments; and

WHEREAS, GASB has issued Statement #54 Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions, which will use new terminology to classify Fund Balance for all Governmental Funds; and

WHEREAS, Designations of Fund Balances which are management's intent for potential use will be replaced by the new term Assigned Fund Balance; and

WHEREAS, Statement #54 requires the governing body to authorize a County Official to establish Assignments of Fund Balance; and

WHEREAS, Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority approval will be required to use of any of the Assignments recorded by Management; and

WHEREAS, The Ramsey County Regional Railroad Authority wishes to continue to improve access to transit services in the region with other agencies, including the Metropolitan Council and other county regional railroad authorities; Now, Therefore, Be It

### A VARIETY OF SAFE AND EFFECTIVE TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS BENEFIT THE COMMUNITY

#### PERFORMANCE MEASURES - HIGHLIGHTS

The Railroad Authority is creating a multi-modal transit hub at the historic Union Depot. A purchase agreement with the United States Postal Service (USPS) for the purchase of the concourse area was completed in April of 2008. Conceptual engineering and an environmental assessment have been completed. Purchase of the Union Depot Headhouse took place in June, 2009. In January, 2010, Construction Manager/Design Team work began on renovation/reconstruction. In February, 2010, Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) funds were awarded to the Railroad Authority in the amount of \$35 million. In May, 2010, the Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) was issued, which allows the Railroad Authority to use \$45.3 million in Federal SAFETEA-LU, 1301 funds towards the project. In November, 2010, the Federal Railroad Administration awarded \$40 million to the State of Minnesota for the Union Depot. In December, 2010, \$9.8 million in State Passenger Rail Bond funds were awarded to the Union Depot project. Project design was completed in the fall of 2010. Possession of the concourse took place December 31, 2010. Construction began January, 2011 and the project will be substantially completed in late 2012.

The Railroad Authority completed an Alternatives Analysis/Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Central Corridor light rail project in 2006. The Federal Transit Administration approved the project for preliminary engineering in December, 2006. Preliminary engineering was conducted by the Metropolitan Council with the cooperation of the Railroad Authority and other project partners. Construction work began in the fall of 2009 and will be completed in 2014. The full funding grant agreement was signed in April, 2011.


The Railroad Authority is participating in the Gateway Corridor Commission to advocate and analyze transportation and transit improvements along the I-94 corridor from the Union Depot in St. Paul to Eau Claire, Wisconsin. An Alternatives Analysis study began in late summer 2010 to study transit improvements from Minneapolis to the Union Depot in St. Paul to Eau Claire, Wisconsin. This study is expected to be completed in the spring of 2012. A Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) is anticipated to be underway late summer 2012.

Recent Railroad Authority performance continues to be consistent with the long-term funding strategy adopted by the Railroad Authority in 2005.

The 2008 Legislature authorized the metro area counties to create a Counties Transit Improvement Board (CTIB). Ramsey County is one of five counties participating in this organization. CTIB provides funding for transitway capital improvements and operations.

#### PERFORMANCE MEASURES - DISCUSSION

- 1. RCRRA purchased the Union Depot Head House in June, 2009.
- 2. Depot Preliminary engineering/final design work began in January, 2010.
- 3. In January, 2011, renovation work on the Union Depot began
- 4. The Union Depot Multi-modal transit hub will become the heart of future transportation in the east metro. In 2012, the Depot will serve Amtrak, regional and inter-city buses, bicycles, pedestrians and the Central Corridor light rail line (opening in 2014).
- 5. A federal full funding grant agreement was signed by the Federal Transit Administration for the Central Corridor light rail project in April, 2011.
- 6. An Alternatives Analysis study began in September, 2010 on the Gateway Corridor from Minneapolis to the Union Depot in St. Paul to Eau Claire, WI.
- 7. A DEIS on the Gateway Corridor is anticipated to begin late summer 2012. The locally preferred alternative will be determined in 2014.
- 8. Corridor planning work will continue on Red Rock, Rush Line, Robert Street, Intercity Passenger Rail (High Speed Rail), Riverview, and other projects to provide improved transit options for citizens.
- 9. Railroad right-of-way that may be needed for future transportation corridors may be acquired, if available.
