

Adult Detention Center Safety & Security/Suicide Prevention

- Continue to provide additional safety and security enhancements to the Adult Detention Center (County Jail), including suicide prevention barriers
- The primary need for this request is in response to the increasing needs of housing individuals with mental health and medical conditions
- This request will continue to fund outfitting additional pods (living units) with suicide prevention barriers on the upper level of each pod.
- One of the primary reasons for this request is to help prevent suicide and self-injuries

Adult Detention Center Safety & Security/Suicide Prevention

- Two of the ten housing units have suicide prevention barriers
- COVID-19 and the high jail population delayed installation by one year
- Goal is to install suicide prevention barriers in all ten housing units at a rate of two per year
- Funding is requested in 2025 (\$1.69m) and 2026 (\$1.83m)
- Funding is available for safety and security enhancements/suicide prevention barriers in 2023 and 2024
