Ramsey County promotes safe firearm storage, harm prevention

Free gun locks available Countywide to prevent accidental shootings, suicide prevention

Saint Paul, MN – Ramsey County leaders stood together to reinforce an important message to residents who have firearms in their homes: Safe Gun Storage Saves Lives.

Launched back in 2016, the <u>Ramsey County Gun Safety Initiative</u> began as a partnership between the Ramsey County Attorney's Office, the Sheriff's Office, and Saint Paul – Ramsey County Public Health. The goal is to educate families about the importance of safe gun storage by providing access to free gun locks through community-based partners across the county.

"One simple act—locking up your gun—can mean the difference between life and death," said Ramsey County Attorney John Choi. "Whether it's a curious child or someone in crisis, a moment of preparation can prevent a lifetime of heartbreak. If you keep a firearm at home, secure it. It's that simple, and that important."

Each year, our community confronts tragic interactions with firearms that can be prevented. Whether the goal is preventing accidental shootings, suicide, or <u>domestic violence</u>, the Gun Safety Initiative encourages all gun owners to lock and secure firearms in the home and educate every member of the family about the importance of gun safety and responsible ownership. With school out for the summer and children spending more time at home, <u>Gun Lock Distribution</u> sites offer residents the opportunity to pick up a free gun lock—no questions asked—at convenient, community-based locations.

"The health and safety of children and families is the foundation of community well-being," said Amy Caron, Saint Paul – Ramsey County Public Health Director. "A gun lock can mean the difference between life and death if a child or teen gains access to an unsecured firearm."

Firearm suicide remains a leading cause of death in Minnesota and nationwide. Data from the Minnesota Department of Health shows that firearms were used in 51% of suicide deaths in 2024. Nationally, half of all youth suicides and 84% of youth homicides involved firearms. In 2020, firearm injury became the leading cause of death for American children and adolescents. In fact, Nearly one child gains access to a loaded firearm and unintentionally shoots themself or someone else every day in America—an average of 350 children a year. Proper firearm storage—including the use of gun locks—is a proven strategy to save lives.



"Research shows that the first few minutes of an emotional or mental health crisis can determine the outcome," said Ramsey County Commissioner Tara Jebens-Singh. "Gun locks create critical distance and time between firearms and individuals struggling with suicidal thoughts."

"Restricting access to lethal means prevents suicide," said Sue Abderholden, Executive Director of NAMI Minnesota. "If you or someone you know is struggling with mental health, call or text 988 for help and hope."
