## **BASIC FUNCTIONS**

The Digital Equity Planning Specialist Fellow responsibilities include: coordinating digital equity program activities, assisting in the development of digital equity policy, strengthening local digital equity ecosystems, performing digital equity focused research and data use, and piloting scalable digital equity models. Provide program coordination in addressing functional broadband affordability and ensuring residents have access to internet-enabled devices, digital literacy training, and quality technical support. Coordinate and collaborate with internal, state, city and community leaders and champions to increase digital equity throughout the county.

## **Summary of Duties:**

- 1. Providing recommendations on issues regarding digital equity, including technology literacy, affordable internet programs, and delivery of community-based digital equity services.
- 2. Researching and identifying digital equity grant programs and assisting in the design, outreach, applicant assistance, review, contracting and reporting.
- 3. Collecting & utilizing data to analyze and adapt programs to align with community needs.
- 4. Conducting outreach and community engagement that further shared community power.
- 5. Representing Ramsey County in collaborative work and outreach with community, industry, interagency and interdepartmental partners.
- 6. Supporting development of awareness and understanding about the significance of digital equity in county efforts and integrate efforts with the county's Racial Equity programs and functions.
