

- Lack of available units
 - Eviction Moratorium

No St. Paul apartments available for families earning \$30,000 or less, report finds


- Distanced learning
 - Lack of childcare for school aged children
 - Providing academic support



Existing Family Shelter Beds and Referral Process

Recent Trends	Requesting Shelter	Total Existing Beds
2019	660	185
2020	484	247

- Only able to serve a fraction of the families in need of shelter
- No immediate shelter for most families
- Families are served by the Ramsey County shelter team
- Referred to shelter as beds become available





Interfaith Action of Greater Saint Paul

Project Home Families and Operations

- 71 families served this past year 130 children and 88 adults
- 87% of children aged 12 and younger
- No drop-ins or walk-ups families referred directly to Project Home from the Ramsey County shelter team
- Formal intake process with a background check
- Staffed 24/7/365 with a minimum two trained staff on-site at all times



Project Home at the Provincial House


- Approximately 20 families for an average 43-day stay
- No drugs, alcohol or smoking allowed
- Curfew / quiet hours from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Designated outdoor play space for children
- Parking needs accommodated in on-site lot
- Volunteer opportunities for neighbors post-COVID



Housing Stability in Ramsey County

Since 2019, a county and city staff workgroup has met regularly to develop and act on solutions that address a serious challenge many communities across the country are facing, including Ramsey County: unsheltered homelessness. The current COVID-19 pandemic and its subsequent economic downturn have only further exacerbated the present housing crisis.

The pandemic has posed unique challenges for our shelter spaces, removing some existing capacity to apply safe social distancing guidelines and increasing the number of people experiencing homelessness in our community. There are currently more than 300 people sleeping outdoors across Ramsey County on any given night. Because of this, Ramsey County, the City of Saint Paul and other partners have been working guickly since this
