Results of a study conducted by Saint Paul- Ramsey County Public Health on emergency department use by Ramsey County residents during 2010-2014 will be presented. The study was developed by the Ramsey County Access to Health Services Action Team as part of its implementation of Ramsey County's Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). The study examined multiple questions including the degree to which emergency department use was potentially preventable.
