COVID-19 illuminated a digital divide and disparities in access, affordability, connectivity and navigation in electronic devices.

Digital Equity as a basic need alongside housing, food, and access to healthcare.


Launched Connectivity Blueprint following CARES funded Workforce Solutions and Saint Paul and Ramsey County Libraries collaboration.

American Rescue Plan Act funded by the city of Saint Paul and Ramsey County. The initiative is led by Ramsey County, Saint Paul and a steering committee of experts. Aimed to create a community-guided roadmap to digital equity through understanding the current policy context and community perspectives on digital equity in Ramsey County and Saint Paul.








Digital Inequities Are Driven By Systemic Inequities With Deep








Digital Inequities Are Driven By Systemic Inequities With Deep Roots

What is ACP?

A federal program that helps eligible households get the highspeed internet they need for work, school, health care and more.

Eligibility

- Income at or below 200% of Fed Pov. Guidelines (e.g., household of 4 = \$60,000)
- Gov't assistance program participation
- Lifeline
- Other provider programs

Enrollment

- Getinternet.gov
- Connect benefits (Service plan & devices)

ACP Eligibility


A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the <u>Federal Poverty Guidelines</u>, or if a member of the household meets at least *one* of the criteria below:

- •Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- •Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program;
- Participates in one of these assistance programs:
 - Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program, including at U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Eligibility Provision schools.
 - SNAP
 - Federal Housing Assistance, including:
 - Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program (Section 8 Vouchers)
 - Project-Based Rental Assistance (PBRA)/Section 202/ Section 811
 - Public Housing
 - Affordable Housing Programs for American Indians, Alaska Natives or Native Hawaiians
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - WIC
 - Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits
 - · or Lifeline;



Trusted Messenger Eligibility

- Trusted community organizations, culturally specific organizations, faith-based organizations, social service organizations, community nonprofit organizations, tribal governments, or community clinics.
- Focus on organizations/groups that provide community assistance to zip codes: 55103, 55104, 55106, 55107, 55119, 55130.
- Contractors must have state or federal recognition

As an ACP Trusted Messenger, you will

- Facilitate relationships, support ACP awareness and enroll historically underserved community members in the Affordable Connectivity Program.
- Utilize ACP and county branded materials and create some of your own.
- Organize at least one tabling event per month.
- Track community member ACP program enrollment.
- Report progress to Ramsey County Digital Equity Coordinator through regular meetings.
