

# Presidential Nomination Primary Facts

## What is a presidential primary?

The purpose of the presidential primary is for Minnesota voters to select the presidential candidate who they wish to be their party's presidential nominee on the Nov. 3, 2020 general election ballot.

## Which major parties are participating in the presidential primary?

The image shows two sample official ballots for the Presidential Nomination Primary election held in Ramsey County, Minnesota, on March 3, 2020. The left ballot is for the Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party and lists 15 candidates for the office of President, plus an 'Uncommitted' option. The right ballot is for the Republican Party and lists only one candidate for the office of President. Both ballots include instructions for voters to fill in boxes next to their choices and a note that Minnesota Election Law permits voting for a candidate of only one political party in a Presidential Nomination Primary election.

Party chairs submitted official candidates by *Dec. 31, 2019*

If a candidate suspends their race after this date, they still appear on the ballot.

Only the office of president is on the Mar. 3, 2020 presidential primary ballot. The primary for federal, state & county offices will be Aug. 11, 2020. You do not need to declare a party for the Aug. primary nor the Nov. general election.

## Will parties have to abide by the primary results?

Yes. The winner of the primary race is the nominee for that party from Minnesota. Voters determine the number of delegates sent from Minnesota to each party's national convention. Delegates gather from each state then select their party's national presidential nominee.
