Transportation Funding

Highway User Tax Distribution (HUTDF)

Revenues

- o Fuel (Gas) Tax
- License Tab Fees
- Motor Vehicle Sales Tax

Distribution to Agencies

- o 62% to Trunk Highway (TH) Account MnDOT
- o 29% to County State Aid Highway (CSAH) Account all 87 counties
- o 9% to Municipal State Aid Streets (MSAS) Account cities with a population over 5,000 (148)

Flexible Highway Account (Turnbacks)

- o 50/50 Split between Metro and Greater MN
- 16% of total split between 7 metro counties based on population (minus Mpls and St Paul)

(1) Governor's Proposal

- o \$0.20 gas tax implemented over 4 years. Cost indexing starting in 2023
- Vehicle registration tax rate change from 1.25% to 1.5%; increase base fee from \$10 to \$20; change the depreciation schedule
- Change motor vehicle sales tax rate from 6.5% to 6.875%
- Return sales tax on motor vehicle repair parts to general fund (statutorily dedicated)

House proposal. Governor's proposal did not include Hennepin and Ramsey Counties.

Metropolitan Area Transit Sales and Use Tax

Governor's proposal – 0.125% retail sales and use tax (2022-2023 Biennium - \$147M or \$73.5M per year)

- o To the Metropolitan Council to maintain and expand the regional bus and transitway system
- For transit purposes within the metropolitan area studies, design, engineering, environmental, property acquisition, operations
- o Be consistent with long-range Transportation Policy Plan (TPP)

House Proposal – 0.5% retail sales and use tax (2022-2023 Biennium - \$590M or \$295M per year)

- o 50% to the Metropolitan Council for transit systems and operating capital (\$147.5M per year)
 - For transit purposes
- o 50% to the Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) (\$147.5M per year)
 - o 30% highways
 - o 30% transit
 - o 10% non-motorized
 - o 30% flexible into one of the three categories above

Transportation Advisory Board (TAB) Federal Funding (for context for House proposal)

- o For the 2018 Regional Solicitation:
 - Year 2022-2023 construction
 - o \$200M in available federal funding for 2-year period (\$100M each year)
 - o 136 projects submitted
 - o 55 projects selected

<u>County Board Resolution (March 26, 2019) - AMC Transportation Funding Support</u>

WHEREAS, Minnesota Counties maintain 30,742 miles of County State Aid Highway (CSAH) roads and 14,141 miles of county roads, totaling over 30% of the state's roadways; and

WHEREAS, The total annual need to maintain the current CSAH and county road system is \$1.084 billion over the next 25 years, which does not include funding for expansion; and

WHEREAS, The annual funding gap for counties has resulted in deferring basic maintenance, delaying expansion projects with resulting safety concerns, mounting congestion, and missed economic growth for businesses and commuters; and

WHEREAS, A comprehensive and sustainable transportation solution should include robust funding for roads, bridges, and transit, and address the varying needs in different parts of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, Increased funding for Minnesota's Highway User Tax Distribution Fund would provide additional, stable funds for the Minnesota Department of Transportation, all 87 counties, all cities with a population of 5,000 or more, and townships across the State; Now, Therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, The Ramsey County Board of Commissioners approves for inclusion in the Ramsey County 2019 State Legislative Platform a resolution of support for a Statewide Transportation Funding package; and Be It Further

RESOLVED, The Ramsey County Board of Commissioners authorizes county representatives to work with members of the legislature and other interested parties to support legislation proposing a statewide funding package to address the needs in roads, bridges and transit.
