# Advisory Councils' Efficacy in Meeting Community and County Needs

Project Timeframe: January – April 2019

Project Scope:

- Assess current state for effectiveness, representation, value to community and county
- Propose recommendations for improvements

Note: Reference to 'councils' represents advisory councils, committees, commissions, boards and groups



#### **Project Team: Cross-department effort**

#### **Methods**

- Surveys, interviews, focus groups:
  - 32 advisory groups
  - 110 advisory participants
  - 37 staff engaged
- Informational research on councils



#### **Key Themes**

What is working well:

- Opportunity to learn and teach
- Relationship-building and networking
- Variety of perspectives
- Being a community voice
- Taking action tangible outcomes



## Key Themes (cont.)

What is not working well:

- Lack clarity about purpose and roles
- Under-utilized, lack connection to work
- Lack diverse representation
- Struggle with recruitment, attendance
- Uncertainty about their impact
- Lack of engagement with county leadership
- Lack of dedicated resources



## Key Themes (cont.)

Systemic / Process issues:

- No county-wide standards, accountability
- By-laws
- Unclear role with County Board
- Barriers to participation
- Lack of transparency
- Wide variation in processes (recruitment, orientation)



#### **Effective Practices**

#### IAP2 Spectrum of Public Participation



- "Residents First" approach
  - Focus on emerging issues, programs/services
- Diverse representation
- Minimize barriers to participation
- Dedicated resources (staff and financial)
- Accountability and transparency regarding impact
- Active engagement from county leaders



### **Resulting Actions**

Staff will:

- Realign and leverage existing councils
- Create county-wide standards, processes, accountability
- Develop 'one-stop' countywide website for information and access
- Establish Board Leadership program
- Recruit and recommend appointees (with council representatives)
- Facilitate joint councils meeting 1-2 times/year



#### **Recommendation for Board Consideration**

Maintain an appointment process for mandated councils with improvements



#### **Next Steps**

- Share findings with advisory groups and staff
- Meet with advisory councils about action plan
- Develop transition and communication plan
- Create board leadership development program
- Develop centralized standards, processes, accountability
- Develop one application for all councils
