SERVICES INCLUDE:

BIRTH CONTROL

- Implant.
- IUDs.
- Birth control pills.
- The Shot (Depo).
- Condoms.
- The Ring.
- The Patch.
- Diaphragm.
- Natural Family Planning (NFP).
- Abstinence.

Emergency Contraception

Prevents pregnancy up to five days (120 hours) after unprotected sex or birth control failure.

PREGNANCY TESTING

Urine pregnancy tests are provided as soon as a period is missed.

- Same day results.
- Counseling offered.



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SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION & HIV TESTING

Services provided for screening, diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted infections (STIs)

Diseases:

- Chlamydia.
- Gonorrhea.
- Herpes - if sore is present.
- Syphilis.
- Trichomoniasis.
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) or genital warts.
- HIV - testing and counseling.

SYRINGE SERVICES PROGRAM

- Anonymous syringe exchange.
- Narcan (overdose reversal medication).
- Wound care.
- HIV & Hepatitis C testing.
- Connection to community resources.

SYRINGE SERVICES HOURS:

Monday: 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

Tuesday: closed.

Wednesday: 1 - 4:30 p.m.

Thursday: 10:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m.

Friday: 10 a.m. - 1 p.m.

HIV PREVENTION PILLS

Education, counseling and payment assistance programs available for the following:

- **PrEP** (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis)
A daily pill to prevent from getting HIV.
- **PEP** (Post-Exposure Prophylaxis)
28 day medication to lower your chance of getting HIV after a possible high-risk exposure from sex or sharing needles.

Medication must be started within 72 hours/3 days of the exposure.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

- Annual gynecological exams, which may include Pap smear.
- Free breast and cervical cancer screening for eligible women.
- Vaccines, including the HPV vaccine (when needed).
