## Budget Information:

Ramsey County developed a budget for COVID-19 while working in high-priority need areas and responding as quickly as possible. We are using \$24 million for immediate response, direct care, public safety, public health and operations, and also investing over \$72 million in the hardest hit areas of our community – homelessness, workforce, financial assistance and small business supports, as approved by the board on May 26, 2020 and July 21, 2020. - **\$24M for Operating Response**
  - **Public Health & Essential Services:** \$246K spent and \$1M obligated for testing and other costs
  - **PPE:** \$2.47M spent so far for masks, gloves, gowns and other PPE for county needs
  - **RECERT:** \$117K spent and \$330K obligated for trusted messenger and community engagement
  - **Other costs:** \$2.64M spent for information technology needs; \$1.1M spent for service redesign; \$1.0M contract for employee childcare; \$400K for public safety response.
- **\$72M for Financial, Workforce Development, Small Business Assistance and Homelessness:**
  - **Food and Financial Assistance:** \$18.3 million in contracts and costs.
    - Applications are increasing for financial assistance and barriers are being reduced. Considering additional programs currently.
    - Five meal delivery contracts have been executed, 2 additional are in process. 15 pantry contracts have been executed and three youth food service contracts are in process.
  - **Workforce Development:** \$8.7 million in contracts and costs
    - All first round contracts have been executed and vendor orientations are being provided.
  - **Small Business Assistance:** \$5.275 million contract with MCCD for small business program with \$4.28 million given out to the community.
  - **Homelessness:** \$9.55 million for payments and contracts for Mary Hall, Boys Totem Town, hotels, staffing, and cleaning.

## Revenues and Resources:

In Ramsey County we are monitoring estimates for revenue losses in 2020 related to COVID-19. We estimate nearly \$5.6 million in revenue losses in 2020, mainly related to arena closures, decreased revenues in parks and reduced bed capacity in direct care facilities and community corrections. We will continue to monitor this.

We are also aggressively pursuing funding opportunities to cover COVID-19 related costs. Below is more detail on the revenue received so far and pending applications.

We have **received** the following funding:

- Federal CARES Act Local Funding - \$96.027 million through the Treasury for local governments.
- Federal CARES Act Provider Relief Fund – Ramsey County Care Center - \$800K based on Medicare fee-for-service billing.
- State Department of Health- Public Health Funds - \$509,000 for COVID-19 work.
- State Department of Human Services - Homelessness grant funds - \$2.6 million for shelter capacity, hygiene/cleaning and staffing (for March-June).
- Federal CARES Act Community Development Block Grant Funding - \$685,000 based on a federal formula.
- Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) Funds - \$58,000 awarded for emergency management response.
- Federal Department of Justice - \$58,008 awarded for law enforcement in the Sheriff Office.
- Election Response: \$421K from Secretary of State and \$2.75M from Center for Tech and Civic Life

We continue to work on **applying for** Federal Disaster Recovery funds (on-going process).
