Calculating RRI

A Relative Rate Index (RRI) is a method for measuring and quantifying racial disparities.

Asian Youth Rate

(occurrences/population)

divided by -

White Youth Rate

(occurrences/population)

A RRI higher than 1

indicates that asian youth are disproportionately over-represented at this decision point.

A RRI **below 1** shows they are under-represented.

A RRI equal to 1 indicates no disproportional contact.

This RRI shows the rates of Asian youth compared with white youth across several juvenile justice system decision points. Each decision point has an impact on the points that follow.

Once referred to CAO... **Decision Point:** Diverted by Asian youth are 36 **32 County Attorney** 1.14 times MORE likely to have their case diverted. Once in court... Adjudication Stayed/Withheld Asian youth are **23** .74 times LESS likely to have their case withheld. **Decision Point: Initial Disposition** Imposed by the Court: Asian youth are **Adjudicated** 2.89 times MORE likely Delinquent to be adjudicated delinquent. Once on probation... **Decision Point:** Asian youth are Sent to .74 times LESS likely **Placement** to be placed.
