Plastic Containers* Cartons

YES Bottles and jugs

Water, soda and juice bottles Milk and juice jugs Ketchup and salad dressing bottles Dishwashing bottles and detergent jugs Shampoo, soap and lotion bottles

Tubs and containers

Yogurt, pudding and fruit cups Margarine, cottage cheese, cream cheese and other tubs Clear berry and produce containers

Plastic bags and wrap Styrofoam ™ Microwaveable food travs Motor oil bottles and other containers that held hazardous products Toys, kiddie pools, plastic utensils, and garden hoses

Glass Containers

YES Food and beverage bottles and jars

Drinking glasses, ceramic dishes and vases Window glass and mirrors Light bulbs

Please empty containers and give them a good rinse. *Leave caps and lids on plastics.

YES Milk and juice cartons Soup, broth and wine cartons

Metal Cans

YES Food and beverage cans

NO Cans that held hazardous products such as paint thinner

Boxes & Paper

YES Mail, office and school papers Magazines, catalogs, newspapers and inserts

Phone books

Shredded paper in closed paper bags

Paperboard (cereal, tissue boxes)

Paper soiled with food Paper plates and cups Paper napkins or towels Pizza delivery boxes Gift wrap
