# What to collect

Knowing what goes in your food scraps collection is important. If an item is not compostable, tossing it in your food scraps bin contaminates the other contents.

# Cut down on food waste!

20% of our trash is food waste.

## 1. Get equipped

Pick up a free food scraps collection starter kit at any Ramsey County Yard Waste collection site. Additional bags are available at all collection sites.

## 2. Collect food scraps

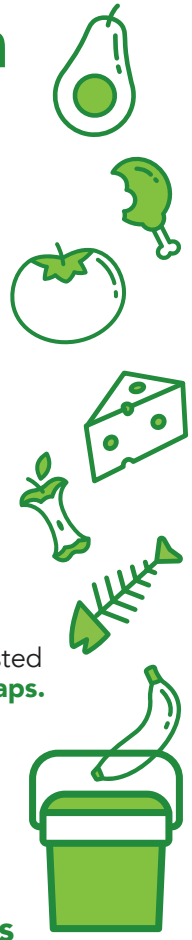
Line your kitchen caddy with a compostable bag and fill with food scraps and other accepted items listed at [RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps](https://RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps).

If using your own bag, be sure that it is marked with the compostable logo from the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) on the bag or the box.

## 3. Drop off food scraps

When your compostable bag is full, drop it off in a food scraps recycling dumpster at one of the collection sites in Ramsey County. For a full list of collection sites, visit [RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps](https://RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps).

Drop off your food scraps on a weekly basis to minimize odor and pests. Store filled compostable bags in the freezer until you're able to drop them off at a collection site.



### ✓ Accepted items:

- Breads, pasta and other grains.
- Coffee grounds and filters.
- Dairy.
- Eggs and eggshells.
- Fruit/vegetable scraps.
- Meat and bones.

### ⊘ Not accepted items:

- Diapers.
- Dog, cat or animal waste of any kind.
- Grass, leaves or yard waste of any kind.
- Plastic, metal, wood or glass.
- Plastic bags.
- Trash and other non-compostable items.
