RECYCLE THESE ITEMS

Place recyclables in a paper bag or loose in the recycling cart or recycling dumpster.



METAL CANS

- Empty and rinse.
- Do not crush.

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS

- Empty and rinse.
- Replace cap.

CARTONS

- Empty and rinse.
- Do not flatten.
- Replace cap.



PLASTIC CONTAINERS

- #1, #2 and #5 containers, bottles and jugs.
- Empty and rinse.
- Do not flatten.
- Replace cap.

PAPER AND BOXES

- Cardboard boxes (all types, except frozen food boxes).
- Flatten and keep dry.
- Mail, magazines and newspapers (with inserts).
- Office, school and scrap papers.
- Paper towel and toilet paper tubes.



Do not include plastic bags. They can jam sorting machines at recycling facilities.

Please bring plastic bags to a retailer or visit PlasticFilmRecycling.org to find drop-off locations.



Apartment and Condo Tenants

State law requires that all residents have the opportunity to recycle. Contact your building manager, landlord or city to request recycling service if it is not currently available.



Please do not include the following items in your recycling cart or recycling dumpster:

- Batteries (see pages 9-12).
- Containers with paint, used oil, antifreeze and other hazardous products (see page 10, place empty containers in trash).
- Electronics (see pages 17-18).
- Needles and syringes (see page 11).
- Propane and fuel tanks (see page 10).
- Ropes, hoses, chains, string lights and other items that may coil around equipment (see RamseyRecycles.com/AtoZ).

Place the following in trash:

- Diapers.
- Dishes, vases and mirrors.
- Foil pouches, bags and wrappers.
- Paper cups, plastic straws and utensils.
- Pipes, hangers, pots and pans, and other scrap metal.
- Plastic bags, Styrofoam™, bubble wrap and other plastic wrap, and black plastic.
- Wrapping paper.

FOOD SCRAPS COLLECTION

Items Accepted

- Fruit and vegetable scraps.
- Meat and bones.
- Breads, pasta and other grains.
- Eggs and eggshells.
- Dairy.
- Coffee grounds and filters.

Put your food scraps to work year-round

Bring your food scraps and other organic waste to a Ramsey County yard waste collection site or 24/7 drop-off site. See RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps for list of locations.

Open year-round. Ramsey County residents only. No business waste.

Recycle your food scraps in 3 easy steps

- 1 Pick up a compostable bag at a collection site. Then visit RamseyRecycles.com/FoodScraps and find out what items are accepted.



- 2 Place food scraps in a compostable bag inside a bin. Any leak-proof bin will do.



- 3 Bring your filled compostable bag to a collection site. Pick up a new bag while you are there.



YARD WASTE COLLECTION SITES

How to recycle at a yard waste collection site in 3 easy steps

- 1 Gather leaves, grass and garden waste separately from trees, branches and shrubs. No stumps.



- 2 Bring yard waste to a Ramsey County collection site. See pages 7-8 for hours, locations and accepted items (not all sites accept branches).



- 3 Add waste to designated yard waste piles. If you have questions, ask a site monitor.



Don't put leaves, grass clippings, brush and other plant material in the trash. It's against the law!



Do you use a fire pit?

Be considerate of your neighbors – never burn wet wood, recently cut wood, plastic, garbage or yard waste. They can be toxic and create more smoke.



Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Quarantine

To prevent the spread of EAB, please dispose of all tree waste at a Ramsey County yard waste site (see pages 7-8).



Used Motor Oil and Filter Collection Shed

The self-service used motor oil and filter collection shed is open 24/7.

Antifreeze is also accepted. Keep them separate.



Items Accepted

- Antifreeze.
- Batteries (all types). **New!**
- Bug killers/repellents.
- Cell phones.
- Cleaners.
- Cooking oil (must be liquid).
- Electrical cords and string lights (no battery packs).
- Fluorescent lights.
- Gasoline.
- Mercury thermometers.
- Needles (see page 11).
- Paint (see page 11).
- Propane tanks.
- Used motor oil and filters.
- Vaping devices (rechargeable).
- Weed killer.

Items safe to put in trash

- Dried up latex paint (remove lid).
- Empty aerosol cans and other containers (except propane cylinders).
- Latex or water-based caulk.

Danger

Do not put propane tanks or rechargeable batteries in the trash or recycling cart.

They can cause a fire or an explosion.

Bring them to an HHW site.



Safe Transport Tips:



- Keep products in original container, upright and tightly sealed.
- Transport in a box or tote in trunk of vehicle.
- Never mix chemicals.

Needles and Syringes (Sharps)

- **Do not** place sharps in the trash or recycling cart.
- Place empty needles and syringes in a hard-sided plastic container with a screw-on cap (like a detergent bottle) and label it "Sharps".
- Bring your sharps container to an HHW collection site. Please inform staff when you drop them off. They will ask you to place your sharps in the collection bin.
- Sharps containing medicine should be brought to a medicine collection site (see pages 15-16).



Find FREE Paint and More

Visit the Product Reuse Center at Ramsey County's year-round household hazardous waste (HHW) collection site (page 9). Leftover products are available on a first-come, first-served basis and selection will vary. Must be 18 years or older to participate.

Types of Items Available

- Automotive products, oil, antifreeze, motor additives.
- Charcoal lighter fluid, camp stove fluid.
- Driveway and roof sealers.
- Fertilizers.
- Household cleaners, polishes, waxes.
- Paint and spray paint.
- Paint solvents, cleaners, turpentine, paint thinners.
- Wood stains, preservatives, oils, polyurethanes.

Note: Reuse items are not available at the mobile collection sites listed on pages 11-12.

Safe Disposal of Your Energy-Saving Light Bulbs

Energy-saving light bulbs are good for the environment and your wallet, plus they can be recycled. Bring them to a Ramsey County HHW collection site (see pages 9-12) or check with a local hardware store.

Recycle these types of bulbs:

- Fluorescent bulbs of all shapes and sizes.
- High-intensity discharge lamps (HID).
- Neon lights of all shapes and sizes.
- LED lights of all shapes and sizes.



Incandescent light bulbs are safe to throw in the trash.



Did You Know?

It's illegal to throw fluorescent light bulbs in the trash because they contain mercury.

Test your home for radon for only \$2



Items NOT Accepted

- Empty or uncapped/unsealed needles and syringes (with and without medicine). Bring them to a household hazardous waste site (see pages 9-12).
- Medicines from businesses, healthcare facilities, long-term care facilities, pharmacies, doctors' offices or veterinary clinics.

Guidelines for dropping off medicines



- Keep medicines in their original container for legal transport.
- Put loose medicines in a clear resealable plastic bag and label it with the medicine name.
- Seal all items in a clear resealable plastic bag.
- Place bag into drop box.



Know What to Throw.

It is illegal to throw TVs and computer monitors with a CRT (cathode ray tube) in the trash.

They contain toxic substances like lead.

Recycling Options for Electronics

City and neighborhood clean-up events

Call your city for dates, hours and fees.

Manufacturer take-back programs

Contact the electronic item's manufacturer.

Curbside pick-up service

Some trash haulers offer pick-up service for their customers (call your trash hauler or city).

Recycle These Electronics

Televisions

Flat screens, projections and older box styles.

Computer Equipment

Computers, monitors, laptops, tablets, keyboards and printers.

Phones and Faxes

Cell phones, corded phones, cordless phones, answering machines and fax machines.

Audio and Video Equipment

CD and MP3 players, radios, speakers, stereos, DVD players, VCRs, record players, video game systems and cameras.


Compost Bin Sale – Save \$20

Don't Trash Broken Stuff – Fix-It!


