





Modern Streetcar was chosen as the Locally Preferred Alternative in a 2017 study to serve the neighborhoods along West 7th, downtown Saint Paul, and the South Loop neighborhood of Bloomington.

Modern Streetcar is nationally and internationally becoming a standard for transit development. Many cities in the United States have well developed modern streetcar networks like San Francisco and Seattle with many more cities expanding streetcar service such as Kansas City, Milwaukee, and Detroit. Advantages modern streetcar have over the existing route 54 bus are:

- Can run in its own dedicated space or share lanes with traffic.
- Can use the same tracks and station platforms as Light Rail Transit (LRT).
- · Level boarding at stations.
- Increased capacity and frequency.
- Reduced air and noise pollution.
