
Community Survey Results for the Davern, St. Paul Ave, Homer, and Montreal Station Areas

Survey Overview

Ramsey County and the City of Saint Paul are working to improve transit service along West 7th Street between downtown Saint Paul, the Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport, and the Mall of America.





Survey Overview

The Riverview Corridor Station Area Planning Survey was made available to the public and focused on the neighborhoods surrounding four planned transit stations at Davern Avenue, St. Paul Avenue, Homer Street, and Montreal Avenue. Valuable input from the community will help inform and create plans to guide future growth and development at transit stops along West 7th. While open to the public, the survey collected a total of 281 responses with a 57% completion rate.












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Homer Ave Station Area









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





Better housing mix.


Affordable and safe for everyone.





Which of the following races do you most closely identify?


