Personal Safety to be discussed at May meeting

Safety and security education is the subject matter focus of Block Captain meetings in 2017. The May meeting topic will be Personal Safety. The February topic was Home Security and Safety, and the November meeting will explore internet and cyber safety.

Awareness is a key component of all crime prevention tips and programs. A frequent question asked of deputies is, "How can I improve my safety?" The answer is often dependent upon the many circumstances involved. Sergeant Tim Schwab will be exploring the issue of how to improve a person's safety at home, work, and out in the community at large. How to be aware of potential problems and how to develop safety habits and strategies will also be discussed.

Pedestrian Safety Is Everyone's Responsibility

Failure to yield the right-of-way and driver inattention/distraction are the main contributing factors in pedestrian crashes.

Ramsey County Sheriff Deputies are joining forces with area police departments to enforce crosswalk laws and raise awareness for the safety of pedestrians. The city of Saint Paul has seen an unacceptable increase in pedestrian/vehicle collisions this year, the problem is also seen in our suburban communities. Work is underway in many ways to address safety on our streets for all.

Watching out for bicyclists, pedestrians, and vehicles when we are out and about in our neighborhoods and city streets throughout the year is always the right thing to do. Enjoy the weather and stay safe.





May is National Bike Month

Bicycles are becoming more and more popular and will be featured frequently during National Bike Month. With more bicycles sharing the road it is important to remember bicyclists and motorists are equally responsible for bicycle safety. The number one factor contributing to bicycle-vehicle collisions is failure to yield the right-of-way — by bicyclists and drivers alike.



About one-half of all bicycle-vehicle collisions are due to a variety of bicyclist behaviors, such as disregarding a traffic sign or signal. The other half are caused by vehicle driver behaviors, such as inattention and distraction.

The best bicycle safety building block is to wear a helmet – a properly fitted helmet!

Pay particular attention on this Wednesday to kids on bikes – particularly if your drive route takes you anywhere near a school or a bike route.

Seat Belt Enforcement: extra patrol efforts scheduled for May 22 - June 4

One fact remains true in the world of traffic safety - seat belts save lives. The Click-It or Ticket Seat Belt Mobilization effort will be operational from May 22 through June 4, 2017, with at least fifty percent of the enforcement hours targeted in the window between 4 pm and 1 am.

The Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) is the state's cornerstone traffic safety program, employing an interdisciplinary approach to reducing traffic crashes, injuries, and deaths on Minnesota roads. The Sheriff's Office, as a partner in the Ramsey County Traffic Safety Initiative (RCTSI), works with TZD on enforcement and education of traffic laws toward the goal of zero deaths on Minnesota roads.

Throughout the year, all nine police agencies in the county work together to address traffic safety behaviors such as Impaired Driving, Seat Belts, Child Safety Restraints, Speeding, and Distracted Driving.

Take the three seconds to fasten your belt – you win by avoiding a costly ticket and could save your life.

Telephone scams hit Ramsey County again

Two active scams appear to be targeting elderly persons in Ramsey County.

The "Jury Duty Scam" has the thief calling people and telling them that they didn't appear for their jury duty and are at risk of a misdemeanor crime and penalty. The scammer then tells them they can stay out of jail by purchasing gift cards and calling the scammer back with the code numbers.

The "Grandchild in Jail Scam" has the thief calling people, pretending to be a grandchild who is in trouble and needs money to get out of jail. Again the bail or fine can be paid with a gift card.

Please don't fall victim to telephone scams. They are easy to spot if you know about them. If anyone calls you and requests gift cards for any law enforcement related reason - it is a scam. If you are contacted, hang up, write down the information of the person contacting you, and call 9-1-1 to report the crime.

Please share this information with your family and neighbors, especially with our senior citizens who appear to be the targets of the phone scammers.
