After Labor Day, our families will be experiencing cheers and tears as the school year starts again. Time again for the reminders for all of us to help the kids get safely to and from their classroom tasks.

Minnesota Department of Public Safety tips:

School bus safety for motorists

- In Minnesota, motorists must stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights or a stop arm when approaching from the rear and from the opposite direction on undivided roads.
- Motorists should slow down, pay attention and anticipate school children and buses, especially in neighborhoods and school zones.
- The best way to be aware of your surroundings (always) is to put the distractions away.
- School bus safety requires participation from students as well as drivers. Parents, it is important to educate your children about proper school bus safety.

Tips for children

- When getting off a bus, look to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder.
- Wait for the bus driver to signal that it's safe to cross.
- When crossing the street to get on the bus or to go home, make eye contact with motorists before proceeding.

The School Safety Patrol, crossings and buses, will be assisting fellow students throughout the year on the journey to and from school. Look for those bright orange traffic flags when driving in the morning and evening hours. The 900+ School Patrol students in suburban Ramsey County are recognized by the Sheriff's Foundation with a roller skating party in December and a big event in May at Aldrich Arena.

Deputies continue to respond to theft reports and are finding many of the victims had left their vehicles unlocked, loaded with valuables, and sitting outside on a driveway or the street. A few bold thieves this summer have entered vehicles and homes through open garages and unlocked doors. Please remind your neighbors to take valuables out of sight, close doors or windows, lock doors, and park in well-lit areas. Prevention is about taking a few steps to make it difficult for the criminals.

The smooth-talking swindlers are continuing to scare people into sending them money to get grandchildren out or keep themselves out of jail. Efforts by our block captains to warn people about these phone scams has had some success, with reports reaching deputies that some seniors did

avoid becoming victims because they heard that scammers ask to be paid with gift cards – a method of payment NOT used by government.

Q: The best way to deal with a phone scam? A: Hang up.

Report those phone scammers who call, and you avoid, online at www.ftc.gov. If you, or someone you know, falls victim and loses money to a scam please call 9-1-1, for a deputy to help.

Opioid overdoses and drug abuse prevention

The President's Commission on Combating Drug Addiction and the Opioid Crisis asked the President on July 31 to declare the opioid crisis a national emergency. President Trump declared the emergency in August.

Earlier this year the Hennepin County Sheriff's Office launched a drug abuse prevention campaign called #NOverdose to build a broad coalition of stakeholders who will assist with educating the community about current drug dangers and trends.

The Ramsey County Sheriff's Office was at the Minnesota State Fair for a

day of helping this effort.



Law enforcement is one part of the effort being undertaken to find community wide solutions to address the real and growing problem of drug abuse impacting families throughout Ramsey County.

One effective step to help prevent future drug abuse is to properly dispose of unwanted and unused medications. Safely dispose of unwanted, expired and unused medicines for free at one of six public drop boxes in Ramsey County (map link) including the Sheriff's Patrol Station. Safe disposal of unwanted medicine helps prevent crime, drug abuse and accidental poisoning. Not flushing medicines down the drain

or disposing of them in the trash helps protect our environment as well.
