The Sheriff's Office Public Safety Services Division provides law enforcement services via contract with seven communities – Arden Hills, Falcon Heights, Little Canada, North Oaks, Shoreview, Vadnais Heights, and White Bear Township. The City of Gem Lake, which had been part of the Contract Cities group for many years, opted to contract with the City of White Bear Lake Police Department beginning January 1, 2018.

Sheriff's Office Citizen Academy scheduled for February

The Ramsey County Sheriff's Office is hosting a Citizen Academy beginning in February 2018. This three-week-six-session course will take participants on a behind the scenes journey of the work and activities of the Sheriff's Office. The course will begin Tuesday, February 20 and continue through Thursday, March 8, 2018. Sessions will run each Tuesday and Thursday for three and a half hours per night, from 6:00 PM - 9:30 PM.

The course is designed to give citizens a better understanding of the duties, responsibilities, equipment, training and facilities of the Sheriff's Office. Topics include patrol procedures, K-9, criminal investigations, crime scene processing, narcotics, crime prevention and the



communication center (911 system). The academy will also include the topics of court orders, civil process, criminal history, and warrants. In addition to classroom training, participants will receive tours of the patrol station, the adult detention center (jail), and other Sheriff's Office facilities.

Applications for the Citizen Academy must be received by Friday, February 9.



There is no fee, the only commitment is that participants are asked to attend all six sessions. At the conclusion of the academy, graduates will receive a certificate of completion. Participants will also be offered volunteer opportunities to continue their partnership with law enforcement.

Applicants must be 18 years of age and pass a criminal history background check. Academy size is limited and preference will be given to those available to attend all the sessions.

Sheriff's Office to Host Scouting Day

Text-to-911 now available statewide

In Ramsey County, and throughout Minnesota, Text-to-911 is an alternative option to calling 911 in an emergency. Texting should ONLY be used when individuals are unable to make a



voice call. Individuals who are deaf, deafblind, hard of hearing or speech impaired may use Text-to-911 as a first contact option.



When Should Text-to-911 be Used?

- •The reporting party cannot speak while a crime is in progress.
- •The reporting party must remain quiet to stay safe.
- •If speaking may cause harm, such as in a home invasion, domestic violence, or human trafficking situation.
- •If the reporting party encounters a suicidal or agitated person.

- •If peer pressure is strong.
- •If the reporting party is deaf, deafblind, hard of hearing, or has a speech impairment.

Location is not as accurate with text as it can be with a call. Be ready to give an address or describe your location. Do not text and drive. It is a crime to text 911 with a false report.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Training Scheduled

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program brings community members and emergency services personnel together for coordinated responses following a catastrophic disaster. During such disasters, communities may not have immediate access to emergency services because of the size of the area affected, lost communications, or unusable roads. CERT trained citizens can help their neighbors and neighborhood.



The Sheriff's Office and emergency personnel train members of neighborhoods, community organizations, and businesses in disaster preparedness and basic disaster response skills. The next training session will begin on Wednesday, March 14, 2018 and continue each Wednesday through May 9, 2018. Class locations will alternate between Arden Hills, Vadnais Heights and Little Canada.

The nine-week training course outline includes:

Disaster Preparedness CERT Organization Fire Safety

Light, Search and Rescue Disaster Psychology Disaster Medical Operations (Part 1)

Disaster Medical Operations (2) Terrorism Final Exercise / Graduation

Upon graduation, CERT members are prepared to assist in their neighborhoods and workplaces following an event when emergency responders are not immediately available.

Requirements

The CERT Program is available to all residents of the State of Minnesota who are 18 years and older. Residents must commit for the entire nine-week session. Classes are limited to 25 students. Equipment and materials will be provided at no charge, thanks to a generous donation by the Sheriff's Foundation.

Winter Driving & Motor Vehicle Thefts

Tis the season for snow, cold, bad roads, and thieves driving off in vehicles left running unattended with the keys in the ignition.

Here's a few quick winter driving safety reminders:

- Under Minnesota law, it is illegal to leave the car unattended and running with the keys in the ignition. But, if you have a remote starter installed, you can start your car without putting the keys in the ignition.
- Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage.
- Clear all snow and ice from windshield and all windows before driving.
- Make certain your tires are properly inflated.
- Never mix radial tires with other tire types.
- Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid gas line freeze-up.
- If possible, avoid using your parking brake in cold, rainy and snowy weather.
- Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface (wet, ice, sand).
- Always look and steer where you want to go.
- Use your seat belt every time you get into your vehicle.
- Stay home. If you really don't have to go out, don't. Even
 if you can drive well in the snow, not everyone else can.
 - Don't tempt fate: If you don't have somewhere you have to be, watch the snow from indoors.

Tips To Prevent Auto Theft:

1. Don't leave your unsupervised car running.
2. Don't leave valuables where easily visible.
3. Park in secure and well-lit areas.
4. Always leave windows up and doors locked.
5. Keep registration and insurance information with you and not in the car.
