SLALOM COURSE TEMPORARY STRUCTURE PERMIT REGULATIONS

A regulation Slalom Course must meet the International Waterski & Wakeboard Federation specifications and not exceed 850' in length at 38' in width (IWSF 8.17). Slalom courses restrict the public use of large areas of water, thus the following regulations are to be adhered to:

- The Cities that are affected **must** give written permission.
- If you are applying for a slalom course on White Bear Lake, you will need written approval from the White Bear Lake Conservation District.
- Property owners, which the course directly affects, must give written permission.
- Surface floats must be submerged or removed when the course is not in use.
- The permit number must be displayed on the end floats.
- The course cannot be a navigational hazard.
- The permit will be renewed annually and any complaints from the previous year will be reviewed.
- When submitting your Temporary Structure Application, you must include copies of <u>all</u> letters of permission and diagrams of where the course will be placed relative to the shoreline.

Your Slalom Course must be removed by November 15th
