TEMPORARY STRUCTURE PERMIT REGULATIONS FOR SLALOM COURSES

A Slalom Course is set up so buoys are placed in a zig-zag pattern. The skier must go around each of the buoys without missing a buoy.

Slalom water skiing uses only one ski with two plates, a front boot and either a toe plate, open binding, or another binding (similar to the front binding) behind the main one.

Slalom courses on county lakes and rivers that are removed after each use do not need a permit.

All permanent slalom courses require a permit. A regulation length Slalom Course is normally over 800 feet long. Due to this large restriction of public areas, the following regulations shall be followed:

- The city's that are affected must give written permission.
- Property owners, which the course directly affects, must give written permission.
- Surface floats must be submerged or removed when the course is not in use.
- The permit number must be displayed on the end floats.
- The course cannot exceed 900 feet in length.
- The course cannot be a navigational hazard.
- The permit will be renewed annually and the previous years' complaints will be reviewed.
- When you return the Temporary Structure Application, you must include copies of all letters of permission.
