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What is Food Insecurity?

A condition of limited access to healthy, culturally-connected and medically appropriate food to support an active and healthy lifestyle.

Goal:

Reduce Shame & Stigma

When basic nutritional needs go unmet, it can weaken community resilience, leading to poorer health outcomes, increased stress, housing instability, and barriers to education and economic mobility.

Food is a Basic Need

Examples of Food Insecurity Screening Questions:

- -Within the past 12 months, did you worry that your food would run out before you got money to buy more?
- -Within the past 12 months, the food you bought just didn't last and you didn't have money to get more.

MN Food Helpline

Program Overview:

- Screen for SNAP, WIC, & provide information on how to apply
- Provide information on community food programs (food shelves, free meals, etc)
- Run by The Food Group, a MN non-profit organization

Eligibility:

Anyone in Minnesota can call to get assistance with food resources

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

- Interpreter services are available (Spanish, Somali, Hmong, and many others!)



Immediate Solutions



Food Shelves

Program Overview:

- A place where people can go to get FREE groceries
- Pre-packed boxes, or some allow client to shop
- Delivery may be available depending on location

Eligibility:

- Some food shelves have service area boundaries
- Some require proof of address or IDs
- Some have income restrictions

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

- Some have limits on how often you can visit
- Call or visit organization's website about hours or if appointment is needed /walk in

Fare For All

Program Overview:

- Pop up grocery store; typically monthly
- Access quality foods at budget-friendly prices
 - Boxes of fresh produce, frozen meats, and specialty boxes (\$10-30)

Eligibility:

- No pre-registration, pre-ordering, or pre-payment
- First come, first serve
- Accepts credit, cash, SNAP, debit

Farmers Markets

Program Overview:

- Offer a variety of fresh and seasonal food, including fruits, vegetables, meats, dairy, eggs, baked goods, and flowers. Some markets may also sell prepared foods and beverages.
- Types: food hub, regular season, winter market, year-round market

Eligibility:

- Hours vary by market. Some are open a few days or evenings a week, others just on weekends.
- Accepts credit, cash, debit, SNAP/Market Bucks

Open to everyone

Program Overview:

- Triple your SNAP/EBT at participating farmers markets with Market Bucks
- Market Bucks match SNAP-EBT spending dollar-for-dollar (up to \$10)

Eligibility:

Minnesota SNAP-EBT card

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

- Market Bucks do not have to be spent in one visit or one location
- You can use the tokens at the same farmers market any day they are open
- Summer Market Bucks expire October 31st
- Winter Market Bucks expire April 30th
- Tokens do not expire!

Long-Term Solutions

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Program Overview:

- Helps pay for food (with EBT card)
- Receive funds on EBT card to purchase certain foods
 - produce, meat/poultry, dairy, breads/cereals, seeds/plants
- Can be used at many farmers markets and stores
 - Find SNAP eligible stores



- Based on household size and income
- You can qualify as a non-citizen if you have a green card

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

Process can take up to 45 days from the time application was submitted to the approval day

- Call MN Food Helpline to be screened for eligibility and get help applying
- Interpreters available
- Apply: mnbenefits.mn.gov



Women, Infants & Children (WIC)

Program Overview:

- Breastfeeding and chestfeeding support for pregnant, postpartum women, infants, and children under 5
- Provides supplemental foods through EBT card
- Health care referrals
- Interpreters available

Eligibility:

- Pregnant women
- Women who have had a baby in the last 6 months
- Women breastfeeding a baby less than 12 months old
- Families with children up to the age of 5
- Families must be income eligible for WIC services
- If meet quals, all documentation status is welcome



How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

• Clinics have day and evening hours and are conveniently located near public transportation

How to refer:

 Call Ramsey County WIC at 651-266-1300 to see if you are eligible & to schedule an appointment



Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) for Seniors

Program Overview:

- Formerly known as "Nutrition Assistance Program for Seniors (NAPS)"
- Provides seniors with a monthly box of nutritious food in partnership with Second Harvest Heartland
- Pick up once per month, or can arrange for a home delivery if homebound
- Short & long-term basis

Eligibility:

- Household size and income criteria (130% poverty level)
- 60 years and older

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

Meals on Wheels

Program Overview:

- Home delivered meals, weekly or daily
- Short-term & long-term basis
- Cultural/diet/medical meal offerings

Eligibility:

- Meet any of these:
 - Age 60 or over
 - Accept Medicaid waiver
 - Unable to regularly prepare meals
 - Homebound
 - Medical condition prevents from getting proper nutrition (not required)

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

7 days

Open Arms of Minnesota

Program Overview:

- Provides free, medically-tailored meals to critically ill Minnesotans on a weekly basis
- Registered Dietitians available free of charge for nutrition counseling & educational services
- One additional household member can also receive meals

Eligibility:

- Minnesota resident living with at least one or more of the following: HIV/AIDS, Cancer, ALS, MS, ESRD, CHF, COPD
- Not living with any of those conditions but still need meals?
 - CADI elderly waiver, alternative care waiver, disability waiver are accepted
- Individuals aren't qualified based on income status
- Any documentation status and past felony charges are eligible

How Quickly You Can Use the Program:

As of 02/12, no new clients, but can be put on a waitlist. Usually, two weeks

- Living with Cancer, MS, ALS, COPD, CHF or ESRD: Submit application






