

Ramsey County Homeless Shelters and Referral Information

Day Shelters supplement homeless and low-income residents when the shelter they staying in only offers shelter on an overnight basis. Case management is often provided. Some shelters have laundry and shower facilities. Meals and basic hygiene products may also be offered. Almost all day shelters provide their services free of charge. Any emergency or homeless shelters that allows residents to stay during the day is also classified under this category.

Emergency Homeless Shelters provide short term relief for the homeless and low-income residents. Usually there is a maximum stay of 3 months or less. Many of these shelters ask their clients to leave during the day. Meals and other supportive services are often offered. Majority of the shelters offer their services free of charge.
