Motion (Mullin/Aasheim) to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **Installation of 2023-2025 Chair**

Kulas recognized incoming Chair, Elisa Rasmussen. He shared information about the process for becoming Chair and the leadership roles Rasmussen has held to date. He also thanked her for her dedication and commitment to the WIB. Rasmussen expressed her excitement for leading this group and acknowledged the importance of the WIB's work at this critical time.

## **Recognition of Outgoing Chair**

Rasmussen thanked Kulas for leading the WIB during many changing and challenging times and presented Kulas with his engraved gavel. Becker thanked Kulas for his tremendous leadership in the community and the important work he has done during the past as Chair of the WIB.

#### **Election of WIB Chair-Elect**

Before opening up nominations for the WIB Chair-Elect, Rasmussen reviewed the roles and responsibilities of the Chair-Elect. Stevens nominated Susan Jambor. After asking for other nominations three times and hearing none, Rasmussen closed nominations. Jambor is excited to take on this role over the next two years.

Motion (Stevens/McClean) to cast a unanimous ballot for Susan Jambor for WIB Chair-Elect for the 2023-2025 term. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote. Jambor abstained from the vote.

#### Chair's Vision

Rasmussen shared her collective vision of the WIB and continues to focus on making connections. She shared a memory of talking with former Commissioner McDonough and his insight of "lead with gratitude", stating that leaders from other WIBs have told her that they aspire to be like Ramsey County. Rasmussen's focus is on connecting with people with whom we help; emerging funding opportunities; continue with the Inclusive Workplace Cohorts; and having fun together.

## **Local Plan and Labor Market Overview**

Becker provided a brief background on WIOA law and the need in write a new Local Plan. Prior to this meeting, background information was sent to the WIB and committee members explaining details of the process as it is important for awareness and for the WIB to consider industries of focus. A tentative draft of the plan is due to the state by the end of the year. Olson shared labor market data on various industries, including employment demographics in Ramsey County and the outlook and trends in those industries over the next five years. The demographics do not consider IT as a standalone industry because tech is imbedded across many sectors.

## Creating a Future-Ready Workforce

Becker introduced Mortenson, co-founder and chief executive officer of World Savvy, a national education nonprofit working to educate and engage youth as responsible global citizens. Mortenson shared information on how World Savvy supports change agents to create more inclusive, adaptive schools to ensure all young people can develop skills and dispositions needed to thrive in a more diverse, interconnected world. Attendees broke into groups to discuss the following aspects for the future of work: 1) when you reflet on trends from Ramsey County, what skills and dispositions stand out s most essential for people to thrive in this work environment; 2) what are ways you observe this rapid change impacting Ramsey County; 3) how are you currently planning for the future; 4) what more can you consider? Discussion focused on who we are, what we face and how we work.
