Good Jobs Challenge Grant: Becker shared that the Good Jobs Challenge is workforce focused on underserved populations and areas, communities of color, women and other groups facing labor market barriers, serving trainees participating in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families and Women, Infants and Children and veterans and military spouses. A Joint Powers Agreement with Hennepin County and the cities of St. Paul and Minneapolis was just approved by the Ramsey County Board. Becker also shared a visual and explained how the grant is structured and the timeline.
